CRITERIA

**FOR AWARDING GRANTS IN SUPPORT OF ANGLICAN PROGRAMS TO BENEFIT
ABORIGINAL PEOPLES WITHIN CANADA**

N.B. Awards are made annually following the May and October meeting of the Anglican Foundation's Board of Directors on the recommendation of the Catholic Apostolic Universal Church Trust Fund Advisory Committee. Applications, in writing, must be delivered to the Foundation by April 22nd each year for the **May** meeting and September 1st each year for the **October** meeting in order to be considered by the Committee before that Board meeting.

1. Programs must have been initiated by Aboriginal community(ies)/organization(s), and must involve Aboriginal people in their development, planning and implementation.
2. Programs must be "to benefit aboriginal peoples within Canada". Applications should indicate these benefits and how they will be achieved by the proposed program. This will be the prime criterion for the awarding of a grant.
3. Programs **must** be endorsed by an Anglican Diocesan Bishop or the General Secretary of the Anglican Church of Canada and *if applicable*, the National Coordinator of Native Ministries.
4. Applications should indicate the degree of local support (financial, contributed labour, etc.) and any other sources of support, particularly financial. Preference will be given to programs having broad financial support, but sole Anglican Foundation financing is not precluded.
5. The **total** amount available each year for distribution is approximately \$15,000.
6. Building projects will **not** be considered; the fund is for programs only.
7. Awards will not be made to programs that have already taken place, or to ongoing operations. Repeat grants will not be made.
8. Preference will be given to innovative programs, programs of benefit to large areas of the church, lay training, programs for disadvantaged people and those in urban centers.
9. Grants will not be made to individuals, but applications will be considered for assistance to individuals, such as travel grants, to be distributed by the program organizers.

All other funding must be guaranteed before the Anglican Foundation money will be forwarded.
