AFC FUNDING IN 2015

AFC celebrates the contributions that Canadian Anglicans have made to numerous faith communities from coast to coast to coast.

Here are some examples of Anglican Foundation funding at work.




Christ Church Cathedral, Vancouver, BC

As part of its *Raise the Roof, Ring the Bells, Feed the Hungry* campaign, Christ Church Cathedral, Vancouver, BC renovated its kitchen in order to prepare meals for Vancouver's homeless and hungry population.

- Renovation and repurposing of a parish hall to encompass day programs operated by L'Arche in New Minas, NS.
- Replacement of the heating system in the parish rectory of St. Philip's Anglican Church in Teslin, YT.
- St. Francis Church in Arviat, NU received funding to proceed with building renovations and improve their outreach programs.
- St. Patrick's Church in Edmonton, AB was able to provide English as a Second Language classes and computers for new immigrants.

Three Cathedrals from Detroit, MI, Buffalo, NY and London, ON hosted an international choral concert and world premiere of two compositions written by Dr. Barry Cabena at St. Paul's Cathedral in London, ON.

Outdoor ramp, St. Michael's Anglican Church, Hamilton, ON

- Installation of an outdoor accessibility ramp and indoor accessible washroom facilities at St. Michael's Anglican Church in Hamilton, ON.
- The Atlantic School of Theology in Halifax, NS used an AFC grant to develop distance education with new technology, and to increase cultural diversity.

- Roofing shingles were replaced on St. James the Apostle Church in Thompson, MB and St. Luke's in Alexis Creek, BC.
- AFC established a new partnership with Hope Air to make it possible for Canadians to have access to free air travel when in need of medical care far from home.

REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS

The theme for AFC's 2015 RFP process was interfaith collaboration. Five grants of \$10,000 each were awards to proposals closely aligned with the theme.

The 2015 recipients were:

Williams Lake Interfaith Circle St. Peter's Anglican Church, Williams Lake, BC

The Circle will develop inclusive, compassionate collaboration and conversations of understanding with Christian, Buddhist, First Nations, and Sikh communities in and around Williams Lake.

Congregational Poverty Action Guide, Edmonton, AB The Guide will be a resource booklet for faith communities in support of the *End Poverty Edmonton* initiative, which includes a strong implementation component. The current partner is Beth Shalom Synagogue, and the Guide will involve other faith groups and municipal collaboration.

Dealing with our Darknesses Renison University College, Waterloo, ON

This program is composed of three Anglican-Muslim community conversations about transgression, penitence, and transformation.

Wisdom of Elders Coming Home Society, Vancouver, BC This program connects Aboriginal

Elders with at-risk city youth to share cultural and spiritual teachings.





Interfaith Community Kitchen, Hamilton, ON

Interfaith Community Kitchen Christ's Church Cathedral, Hamilton, ON

The program will be jointly organized by Christians and Muslims, and will provide a community kitchen, English as a Second Language classes, and job skills to the local community.







Each Hope Bears comes with a special prayer for a college student, a wedding couple, for bedtime, baptism, or a birthday a very special way to tell our children, "We care about you."


