THE ANGLICAN FOUNDATION OF CANADA was created by a motion of General Synod in 1957 to encourage and support ministry within the Anglican Church of Canada.

Leading the way in resourceful ministry since 1957, AFC has benefited dioceses, hundreds of parishes, and thousands of Canadian Anglicans with the provision of financial support for ministry from coast to coast to coast.

As a member-based organization, AFC invites individuals, parishes, and church organizations to make an annual contribution so that it can respond generously to applicants who are engaged in ministry to serve the Canadian Church. The Foundation's ability to support ministry is also funded by bequests, memorials and special gifts, donor-designated trusts, life insurance, gift annuities, and investment income.

A Board of Directors chaired by the Primate of Canada includes appointed and elected lay and ordained representatives from across Canada. It meets twice per year to review applications, award grants, bursaries, and loans, and direct strategic planning and development.

The work of the Foundation is made possible through the devotion, generosity, and collective goodwill of hundreds of donors. The support of dedicated Anglicans of all ages makes it possible to sustain the Foundation in the ministry of generosity to the Canadian Church.

#### **MEMBERSHIP**

When a Foundation for Canadian Anglicans came into being in 1957, it was agreed that every parish would contribute \$50 per year in order to support ministry and mission throughout Canada. Over 50 years later, we continue to give parishes and individuals the opportunity to make a regular contribution.

# Toonie Membership for children and youth

Here's how it works:

- 1) Your youth group, church school, confirmation class, or choristers collect toonies during a special season like Lent or Advent
- 2) Send your donation to the Anglican Foundation
- 3) We place toonies in our Kids Helping Kids Fund which provides:
  - breakfast for kids before school
  - after-school homework coaching
  - the chance to go to choir school or summer camp
  - palliative care for children with an end-of-life diagnosis
- 4) Each young donor receives:
  - a membership card
  - · a certificate signed by the Primate

Membership gives you a unique chance to be part of things that really matter in the Church. Your participation in the Foundation can literally make a difference in someone's life.




#### HOW MEMBERSHIP DONATIONS ARE USED

We believe your donation dollars are important. You want them to make a difference, and so do we!

At the Foundation, we direct your dollars toward projects that make ministry happen and where financial need is greatest.

### Here are some examples of where money is spent:

- education for the formation of well-prepared lay leaders, clergy, and academics in order to build a strong Church
- repair, renovation, and restoration of church buildings that provide space for worship, community events, spiritual growth, outreach, music and the arts, and learning opportunities
- accessibility ramps so that churches are a welcoming place for all people
- life-changing experiences for children and youth through music, the arts, drama, worship, and summer camp
- provision of compassionate spiritual and medical care to children with an end-of-life diagnosis
- grants for theological students to provide excellence in spiritual formation, strong biblical and theological instruction, and leadership development in order to sustain an enduring Anglican Church
- opportunities for church musicians and choristers to compose, sing, and play inspirational music for today's Church
- funding for before-school breakfast programs in order to raise healthy kids
- funding for after-school homework clubs to provide a supportive learning environment
- ecumenical, inter-faith partnerships and outreach initiatives
- elder-care and housing
